



Upper Terrace
Flagstones in random pattern with areas of *Erigeron karvinskianus* and *Scillas* planted between slabs

Lower Terrace
Cathedral York stone in random pattern. *Mind Your Own Business* planted in cracks.

Steps
York stone steps. Risers planted with *campanula*.

Retaining walls
Painted clay brick walls level with concrete retaining wall. Planting holes in wall. York stone coping on top of existing and new retaining walls

Raised Bed
Filled with fragrant plants for year round interest

Flower beds
Edged with low whitewashed brick walls. Filled with shrubs, herbaceous perennials, ferns and bulbs

Garden Wall
Painted Farrow & Ball off-white. Topped with trellis panels from Stuart Garden Architecture. Trellis planted with *Clematis*, roses, jasmine & passionflower

Wooden garden door
Replace with close board gate, strap hinges in mild steel with round top to match curve of trellis panel over gateway. Supplied and fitted by S G Architecture

Fence
Iroko fence to level with top of wall height, topped with square trellis both by S G Architecture

Pergola
Hard wood pergola (S G Architecture) covered in climbing plants. Paved space below for dining table or shady seating

Wall trellis and Training wires
Trellis panels on house walls by Stuart Garden Architecture

Fitted seat and Garden bench
Fitted seat between retaining walls on lower terrace. Garden bench on upper terrace under planted with *Gallium odoratum* and *Primroses* in paving cracks both supplied and fitted by S G Architecture

Garden Store
Reduced opening with doors by S G Architecture

Lighting
Various circuits of lighting to pick out garden features

Roof Terrace
Top wall with iron railing, floor with cedar decking. Vines climb up from ground level to cover the railing

Versailles planter
Planted with a bay tree. This will disguise the end of the retaining wall. Supplied by S G Architecture

Garden tap
Tap on lower terrace with stone sink below

House walls
Painted up to 1800mm from ground and vine covered

Tree
Cydonia oblonga 'Quince tree'. Blossom in spring, beautiful, edible and scented fruits, leaves colour in autumn, gnarled and twisted branches at maturity

Birds
Birdbath, bird feeder and nesting box
